Let's take a walk down memory lane. The time was in the early 30's and my youngest brother and I loved to fish. The Bay at that time was full of fish, Perch, Smelt and Bass. Our fishing equipment consisted of hand held lines, with old hooks and a nut or an old spark plug for the weight. Our hooks were baited with pile worms, which to get, we had to go down an old rickety ladder under the pier. The pier was wet and slippery and one misstep could mean a dip in the Bay. Since we were both good swimmers we didn't fear the water as much as the punishment we would have to get if we arrived home in wet clothes, which would also result in a ban on our fishing. So we were very careful as we scraped the pile worms with an old coffee can attached to a stick. When we had enough bait, we would walk to the end of the pier and start fishing.

It was quite a thrill to catch a big Leopard Shark despite that the line would burn your hands and fingers as it made its runs.

The Smelt we caught, which were food for the table during those years of depression, our mother would de-bone and cook *a la Milanese*. I've tried to match her recipe, but never ever came close.

Sturgeon fishing should be good after a heavy rain and this is the time of the year that Rubber Lip Perch come into the South Bay to spawn ... try grass shrimp for bait ... It's a very tasty fish to eat.

Isle of Capri ... Remember that old romantic love song, "It Was On The Isle of Capri Where I Met Her"? Ever since I first heard that song, I wanted to go there. It's said that that if you wait long enough all of your dreams will come true. So when our cruise ship docked at Sorrento, we took the ferry to Capri. Back in the days of the Roman Empire, the wealthy built beautiful villas and vistas and during their hot summers brought family, mistresses and household servants there. The island is fairly small with shops and restaurants near the shore and more shops and tourist traps about halfway up the the island. The roads are narrow and twist around the hillsides and when a bus and a car meet on the road, there is a minute bit of clearance between them. The bus drivers pride themselves on their driving skills in avoiding collisions.

BOC Legislative Issues

Coastal Marina Permit – assembly bill – Although the State Water Board is temporarily suspending its work and the

Release of draft of the bill, there continues to be research and gathering of data on the issues. The State Water Board plans to revisit in March of next year in order to decide what might be the most appropriate course of action to take to safeguarding water quality.

Anti-Fouling Surfaces – RBOC continues to follow and be involved with this important issue affecting boaters and the use of copper-based paints. Several regulatory agencies and other research groups are now becoming engaged for forcefully in this issue although the California Department of Pesticide Regulation (DPR) has indicated this process could take years.

Boater Access – There are several boater access issues along the Sacramento San Joaquin Delta and other areas such as the proposed changes in hours boaters can access and transit the Oakland Estuary bridges. RBOC will be working for recreational boaters to assure we continue to have access to our waterways.
